How will we celebrate?

Is it too early to think about Easter? The celebration of Easter is the very reason for keeping Lent. Most practically, I think about how if I eat chocolate every day, I don't really stop to appreciate it the same way. I have to slow down; I also have to experience life without chocolate in order to better enjoy it.

There's a story about a monk who was given a large ring of smoked sausage for Easter, but it was still Lent, so he hung it up in his room. In this monastery, forbidden meat for all of Lent, the monk smelled the smoked meat day after day, his mouth watering. Finally, on Good Friday, he could take it no longer, and he ate it.

Are we fasting because we must? Are we fasting because it gives us power and strength and discipline? Maybe a cautious "yes" to these questions, but the real reason we fast is to prepare our hearts. We recognize that certain foods, however good, are not all-important or even necessary. So, then, we do this in order to enjoy more the celebration? The loud music is more powerful after a quiet passage. The meat is tastier after we spend time without.

Yet even so, the purpose of our Lent is not to enjoy the meat more but rather to celebrate the Resurrection. Our celebration of the Resurrection is richer because we save some things aside to give greater joy to our hearts when the day comes.

In fact, Christ is already Risen—a historical reality for the past two millennia or so. We celebrate Easter each year for a time because the rise and fall of liturgical seasons helps us to deepen our reflection and better embrace the Resurrection, as with each of the feasts through the year.

So, how will we celebrate Easter? And what are we doing today so that we will be better able to celebrate Easter this year?
